A Message from Bishop Danny

Dear Parishioners.

I am sure that Jesus' disciples would have wanted Jesus to remain with them. rather than return to His Father in Heaven. However, being with His Father in Heaven is Jesus' home. Here He had lived for all eternity and here He will continue to live.

Having returned to Heaven, Jesus naturally continued to love his disciples from Heaven, And, 10 days later, at Pentecost they would experience the full force of the joy, peace and power of Jesus' love pouring down on them from Heaven. This moment – the coming of the Holy Spirit – the eternal, burning love of God – was to transform the disciples. From this point, God was within each of them and each of them went out preaching with power and working many miracles. So, the Church was born and could spread, by the power of God's Spirit alive in each of us, all over the world. So, from this point of view, Jesus' ascension was necessary – so that the Holy Spirit could come into our hearts and set each baptized Christian alive with God's Spirit.

We are created in God's image to live in unspeakable joy and peace with God for all eternity. Death is our passage from this life to the next, from this home to our real home. Childcare Centre

Thanks to all who have provided comments on the proposed parish childcare centre. I have passed all the comments on to Franceyn O'Connor of Sydney Catholic Early Childhood Services (SCECS). As mentioned, we are particularly concerned to ensure the residents of the Msgr Peoples Retirement village continue in quiet enjoyment. SCECS will need to wait for Fr Sebastian and the Archdiocese to approve the project. Then they will move to seek Council approval. SCECS will be responsible for building and operating the Childcare. They will have a 10 year lease with the option for a further 10 years. After this period, the building reverts to the Parish.

Corpus Christi Procession

On Sunday 19 June there will be a Corpus Christi procession in the city. The details are elsewhere in the bulletin. With COVID the procession has not been held for the last two years. First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.' Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.' As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.


Gospel

Then he took them out as far as the outskirts of Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. Now as he blessed them, he withdrew from them and was carried up to heaven. They worshiped him and then went back to Jerusalem full of joy; and they were continually in the Temple praising God.
