A Reflection from Fr Sebastian

Gospel Reading Luke 10:1-12,17-20

Jesus sends out 72 people to announce the coming kingdom. Families teach a sense of togetherness and community. It is in the family that we learn that we are dependent on one another and where we learn to work together and live together. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out the 72 disciples in pairs, a sign that we are to work together to serve the mission of the Kingdom of God.

Talk about all the ways that your family works together. Talk about the various chores and tasks that family members work on together to accomplish in order to keep the household running smoothly.

Read aloud Luke 10:1-12,17-20. Talk about why it was important that Jesus sent his disciples out in pairs. Discuss ways that your family can work more closely together to support one another and to make the household run more smoothly. Pray for the strength to overcome the temptation to be too individualistic and to recognize the need for working together as a family.

Thank you for the **warm welcome** each one of you gave me last weekend. It is wonderful to be here with you to be part of your spiritual journey, in which we can spread the Love, Peace and Joy of Jesus among us. May our families and our PARISH FAMILY work together to support each other in our mission of following Jesus and witnessing His presence among us and in our society.

Sacramental program - Confirmation



The Sacrament of Confirmation at All Hallows will be celebrated on **Sunday 21 August at 12.00pm and 2.30pm**. Anyone in Year 6 or older who has been baptised and has received First Holy Communion in the Catholic Church is invited to enrol.

A Parent Information evening will be held **Wednesday, July 20 at 7.00pm** in the church (children do not need to attend this meeting). Preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation will begin in term 3 and the program is made up of three sessions and a rehearsal.

Mass attendance during the program is required, since the sacraments are an initiation into the Church and one of the basic features of our faith is that we gather on Sundays for Mass.

Registration for Confirmation is now open. Please go to our website for the link to register online (under the Sacraments tab / Confirmation).

Registration forms are available in the gathering space of the Church if you're unable to register online. Please hand in the registration forms at the Parent Information evening.

Please note that registrations close strictly on Friday, 22nd July, 2022.

<p>Lk 10:1-12. 17-20 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Your peace will rest upon him.</p> <p>The Lord appointed seventy-two others and sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the towns and places he himself was to visit. He said to them, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start off now, but remember, I am sending you out like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road. Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.</p> <p>Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, that on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'</p> <p>The seventy-two came back rejoicing.
